



Frank Henry Fallows Sr.

Frank Henry Fallows, Sr. age 76 of Millville, passed away Friday, March 20, 2015 at Jefferson University Hospital in Philadelphia, PA. He had been in declining health for the past several months.

Born and raised in Millville, he was a lifelong resident. He attended Millville High School and then served in the U.S. Army from 1956 to 1959.

For 47 years Mr. Fallows worked for Wheaton Glass Company as an Electro Mechanic Technician and retired in 2007.
